
Consultation: Responsible Supply Chain Policy



Objectives

- To reflect the key views and attitudes of key suppliers regarding MYTILINEOS' new Responsible Supply Chain Policy in accordance with international best practices.
- The readiness of MYTILINEOS' suppliers to meet specific commitments, as described in the Responsible Supply Chain Policy.



Key Findings

- 1. An extremely high percentage of key suppliers recognizes the importance of the Policy as well as the completeness of its Principles
- 2. Suppliers recognize the need to improve their level of maturity in meeting the basic requirements of the Policy
- 3. It illustrates the potential contribution of the Policy to enhance the proactive management of the essential sustainability issues that suppliers recognize
- 4. It reflects the stereotypical perception that sustainability management contributes primarily to the Company's reputation
